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Woodlines of Western Australia

Subtitled A comprehensive history of the Goldfields woodlines this book, by Phil Bianchi and published by Hesperian Press in 2018, covers the privately owned train lines which extended up to 120 miles out from major centres such as Kalgoorlie to bring in firewood. The Kurrawang and Lakewood woodlines are the main feature of this book; other lines include Lakeside south of Boulder, Kurramia/ Kanowna, Cue, Laverton, Gwalia and Westonia. The book is full of anecdotes and social history of the workers in the harsh goldfields environment. 449 pages, 170mm x 240mm, french flaps, heavily illustrated with locality and routes of the lines.. Rails to Rubicon:

A History of the Rubicon Forest

This book by Peter Evans was first published by the LRRSA in 1994. This second edition is a hard-cover book of A4 size with 200 pages and about 240 illustrations.

The book describes the 2 ft, 3 ft, and 3 ft 4½ in gauge tramways in Victoria's Rubicon forest, and the 2 ft gauge tramway which connected the forest with Alexandra railway station. The tramways were used for the timber industry and for a hydro-electricity scheme.

Australia's Colourful American Locomotives Their Art & Architecture, 1876-1920

By David Fletcher. This book shows the livery of American locomotives at the time of their import to Australia. It dispels – once and for all – the myth that American steam locomotives have traditionally been black! With the exception of Shav and Climax geared locomotives, it includes all known American steam locomotives delivered to Australia from the first in 1876, up to 1920. The locomotives worked in every Australian state, and in every type of service from tiny 2 ft gauge sugar tramway locomotives, to mainline broad-gauge goods and passenger locomotives. The author, David Fletcher, also explains the influence of classical architecture on the development of the style of American steam locomotives in the nineteenth century.

By Norman Houghton. The Great Western Coal Mining Coy was established in Colac during 1897, with the first coal being extracted that year from the mine site at Grass Creek, near Deans Marsh. The Deans Marsh Tramway Co was formed in 1898, to connect the mine with the Forrest railway. The tramway was broad gauge and was operated with locomotives acquired from the Victorian railways. An incline tramway was used to lift coal from the mine up to the tramway.

It includes extensive details and maps of numerous tramways, which provided transport from the coast before the coming of the South Gippsland Railway. The 2 ft gauge steam operated Goodwood tramway from Port Albert is covered in detail, as is the 2 ft 6 in gauge Victorian Railways Port Welshpool line. The illustrations, including photographs, maps and diagrams are some of the best to be produced so far in an LRRSA publication.
